Supervisors Hang 9/11 Remembrance Flag

WAYNE COUNTY - The Wayne County Board of Supervisors approved several resolutions to continue work at the new nursing home work site.

At the regular meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 16, the Board approved the purchase of Builders Risk Insurance for the new nursing home, as well as accepting bids for food service equipment from Cable-Wiedemer in the amount \$549,000, and special testing and inspections from SJB Services for \$54,500. These, among other resolutions regarding the nursing home, were opposed by Butler Town Supervisor Dave Spickerman, Lyons Town Supervisor James Fabino and Huron Town Supervisor John Young. Fabino and Spickerman further opposed authorization granting the Board to obtain a permanent easement from Robert Norman for property he owns on Route 31. The easement is necessary in order for construction on the new nursing home site to continue. According to the Board, work at the construction site requires an upgrade of all utilities on county property. To accomplish the upgrades, equipment must be moved on Norman's property, encroaching on a portion of the property. The resolution also calls for an assurance that the property will be left in a condition as close as possible to how it was found.

In other news, the Board agreed to fly the 9/11 Memorial

Flag at the county courthouse during the month of September every year in honor of the tragic day in 2001. The flag was created by resident Steve Galvin and was designed to honor those who died in the Twin Towers, at the Pentagon and on Flight 93 which crashed in Pennsylvania.

The Board also is seeking proposals to complete the county master plan. Wayne County terminated the present agreement for the preparation of the master plan formerly with Cynthia Hill of FRESH Perspectives Land Use Planning. Although considerable work has been completed on the plan, the Board says there is still much to be done before the master plan can be finished. Wayne County Planning is authorized to prepare and issue a request for proposals in the coming weeks.

In other business, the Board:

- * rejected all bids for the courthouse flag pole and renovations;

- * awarded the bid for curb and sidewalk installation on the North Main Street Project for the highway department to Architectural Stone in the amount of \$24,697.50;

- * appropriated funds for the proposed project on Knickerbocker Road, Ontario, \$135,000, and the project on Walworth-Marion Road, \$20,000, and;

- * approved and agreement with Government Payment Systems for purpose of using credit cards as payment for cash bail at the Wayne County Jail.
