Scholarship Fund:

Xerox people at Xerox Special Information Systems (X SIS) in Monrovia, Calif., donate their slightly used business-wear to Working Wardrobes, a non-profit organization in Orange County. Our people drop-off their business accessories and gently-used men's and women's business suits, slacks, shoes, dresses and skirts in a "corporate closet," and coordinators track the number of "hangers" that are donated. A friendly competition with local companies reveals that our numbers (more than 3,500 so far) continue to stay on top. This project is sponsored by the California Women's Alliance, the California chapter of the Hispanic Association for Professional Advancement, the Xerox Community Involvement Project, as well as coordinators and donors from X SIS in Monrovia and other Xerox campuses in El Segundo.
