After her husband Steve died of cancer in 2005, Joanne Galvin vowed to continue the work they had started to honor victims of the 9/11 attacks.

In 2001, Joanne and Steve Galvin wanted to do something after this horrific tragedy. So they came up with the idea of remembrance flags, which they designed themselves.

Sales of the flags have helped raise money for the memorials dedicated to the victims.

Joanne says that would make her husband proud. What Joanne didn't expect was the special bonds these flags created between

her and families of the victims.

The widow of one of the victims was the first to call to thank Joanne and Steve for the flags.

Patricia Scales has since been to Wayne County to visit Joanne and the two have formed a closed friendship. Scales husband, Colonel David Scales, was killed in the Pentagon attack.

Joanne says coming face-to-face with these families is so emotional, yet, it also helps her deal with her own loss since her husband Steve died of cancer.
